Purpose of a Community Health Needs Assessment

A community health assessment identifies the key health needs and issues within a community through systematic, comprehensive data collection and analysis. Hospitals along with key community stakeholders collaborate to develop a community roadmap using reliable data gathered through primary and secondary sources. This roadmap then drives the community's improvement plans and activities over the course of the next three years.

What is a Community Health Needs Assessment (CHNA)?

The 2010 Affordable Care Act stipulated that every registered 501(c)3 hospital complete a Community Health Needs Assessment, or CHNA, every three years. Clara Barton Medical Center previously conducted CHNAs and issued reports in 2012, 2015, 2018 and 2021. The purpose of the assessment is to better understand the current health needs of residents in the hospitals service area and to help identify and prioritize where and how improvements can be made. The hospital's CHNA is a collaboration with the community health department and other community health providers and interested stakeholders. The requirements include the following:

- A description of the community served by the hospital Analysis of quantitative health care issues data for the community served.
- Analysis of quantitative health care issues data for the community served. The Community
 Assessment Team started meeting regularly starting November 2, 2023 to analyze quantitative
 data.
- The issuance of a community health needs assessment survey. The survey was created and made available to county residents on January 2, 2024. Data was collected for a 6-week period.
- A review of current efforts to address the health care issues of the community based on the survey and quantitative data. Quantitative and survey data was collected, compiled, and reviewed once the survey closed-up until the townhall meeting was held in May 2024.
- Townhall meeting to collaborate with the community to formulate a 3-year action plan. The quantitative and survey information was shared with key community stakeholders in the townhall meeting on May 01, 2024. The group discussed the secondary data collected as well as the survey results. The group identified strengths and weaknesses in the community and developed a priority list of improvements that need to be addressed. With a list in hand we can then strategize ways to improve and overcome these challenges moving forward.

Regulations

- Benchmark progress annually on the non-profit Form 990 informational return.
- \$50,000 fine for each year the hospital is out of compliance.
- The hospital is required to make the CHNA "widely available to the public" by posting it on their website.



Community Description

For the purpose of this assessment the target area is Barton County. According to the U.S. Census Bureau, the county has a total area of 901 square miles, of which 895 square miles is land and 5.2 is water. The geographic center of Kansas is also located in Barton County.

As of 2022, the county population was 25,080. The county was founded in 1872 and the county seat is Great Bend. The county is named in honor of Clara Barton, responsible for the founding of the American Red Cross. Cities residing in Barton County include; Great Bend, Hoisington, Ellinwood, Claflin, Pawnee Rock, Olmitz, and Albert. Barton County is the site of Barton County Community College (1965), the SRCA State Historical Drag Strip and Cheyenne Bottoms Wildlife Area the largest marsh in the interior of the United States. The area is critical habitat for several threatened and endangered species, including the whooping crane, bald eagle, peregrine falcon, least tern, and piping plover.





Top Community Issues Identified by the committee based on the quantitative data

Heart Disease/Heart Attack - #1 & #3 causes of deaths in our community, #1, #4 & #5 leading causes of hospital admissions and #6 risk factor for the Medicare population.

High Blood Pressure – #1 risk factor among both the Adult and Medicare populations. Both percentages increased significantly from last years CHNA. It also moved up to #1 from #3 as a chronic risk factor.

High Cholesterol - #2 risk factor for the Medicare population and is also ranks #2 as a chronic disease risk factor.

Cancer - #2 cause of deaths in our community, even with our screening rates looking good.

Adults who smoke 18.4%

Pneumonia - #2 leading cause of hospital admissions.

Arthritis - #2 risk factor for the adult population and #3 for the Medicare population.

Mental Health - #3 Depressive Disorder and #4 Depression risk factors for the adult population and is the #3 leading cause of hospital admissions. Barton Counties Mental Health Index ranking is a 4, on a scale from 1(low need) – 5 (high need).

15.2% report 14+ days the past month where they experienced poor mental health.

Overweight/Obesity - #3 and #4 risk chronic disease risk factors.




The trend for all cancer rates in Barton County is going down from prior values.




1. **Prostate Cancer – 130.8** last CHNA 153.3: This is the most common cancer in American men, except for skin cancers. Most prostate cancers are found in men over the age of 65. African American men and Hispanic men are more likely to develop prostate cancer than men of other races.




2. Female Breast Cancer – 125.9 last CHNA 133.2: Among Kansas women, breast cancer is the most commonly diagnosed invasive cancer, and the 2nd leading cause of cancer death.




3. Lung & Bronchus Cancer – 49.5 last CHNA 62.6: In Kansas, lung cancer is the leading cause of cancer death. Smoking and Secondhand smoke are the main risk factors.



4. Colorectal Cancer – 38.6 last CHNA 48.62: In Kansas, colorectal cancer is frequently the second or third leading cause of cancer death among men and women. 90% or more occur in people aged 50 or older.







- 1. Heart Disease 91.8 last CHNA 92.6: Heart Disease is the leading cause of death in the U.S., causing about 1 in 4 deaths.
- 2. Pneumonia 36.1 last CHNA 38.5: Pneumonia is an infection of the lungs that can cause mild to severe illness in people of all ages.
- 3. Mental Behavior 31.1 last CHNA 34.8: Mental Health is one of the leading causes of disability in the U.S.
- **4. Heart Attack 26.6 same as last CHNA:** Heart Attack occurs when the blood flow to the heart is blocked, and the lack of oxygen and nutrients results in heart damage or death
- 5. Congestive Heart Failure 16 last CHNA 13.7: CHF happens when the heart cannot pump enough blood and oxygen to support other organs. It is serious and about 1 in 9 deaths include heart failure as a contributing factor.
- **6. COPD 13.3 last CHNA 14.6:** COPD refers to a group of diseases that cause airflow blockage and breathing-related problems.
- 7. Diabetes 13.2 last CHNA 18: Diabetes is a group of diseases marked by high levels of blood glucose resulting from defects in insulin production, insulin action, or both. Persons with diabetes are also at increased risk for ischemic heart disease, neuropathy, and stroke.
- Stroke 9.6 last CHNA 11.8: Stroke is a leading cause of death in Kansas and the U.S. and is a major cause of serious disability for adults.
- 9. Poisoning 2.6 last CHNA 1.4: Poisoning involving drugs that affect a person's mental state is the leading cause of injury death in the U.S.
- **10. Asthma 1.8 last CHNA 2.1:** Asthma is a condition in which a person's air passages become inflamed, and the narrowing of the respiratory passages makes it difficult to breathe.

LIFE EXPECTANCY IN BARTON COUNTY IS 76.9 years

Of the Counties in Kansas Edwards has the lowest value at 64.7 and Johnson is the best at 81.4. Half of the counties fall between 75.6 and 78.4.



People with an **ambulatory** difficulty experience serious difficulty walking or climbing stairs. These difficulties may in turn limit their physical activity, leading to a further decline in health. Persons with an ambulatory difficulty may have unique requirement for accessibility, such as ramps or elevators. (8.7%)

People with a **cognitive** difficulty experience serious difficulty concentrating, remembering, or making decisions due to a physical, mental, or emotional condition. Cognitive difficulties can have a large impact in everyday activities and may lead to challenges at school or work. People with a cognitive disability may have particular difficulty with math, visual, reading, linguistic, and verbal comprehension. (7%)

Hearing impairment can impose a social and economic burden on individuals and families. In children, hearing impairment may delay development of language and cognitive skills, which may hinder progress in school. In adults, hearing impairment often makes it difficult to obtain, perform, and maintain employment. Hearing impairment can lead to depression, withdrawal, or isolation. (5.4%)

People with a **self-care** difficulty encounter challenges in performing activities of daily living (ADLs), such as dressing or bathing. Depending on the severity of the disability, people with a self-care difficulty may require additional assistance in the home to conduct daily activities. (3.1%)

People with **vision** difficulty encounter challenges in performing daily activities such as reading, cooking, and taking medication. An adult whose vision becomes impaired may need to learn new ways of completing tasks. Vision impairment in children can


affect cognitive, emotional, neurological, and physical development by potentially limiting the exposure to information and typical child experiences. (2.8%)

People with a disability are more likely to live in poverty as compared to the rest of the population. The poverty rate is especially high among persons with long-term disabilities. Without adequate income, individuals with disabilities may not be able to afford necessary expenses, such as rent or mortgage, utility bills, medical and dental care, and food.




In Barton County the percentage of adults with a disability living in poverty is 30.5%. Of the counties measured the lowest value is Gray County at 2.8% and the highest is Doniphan County at 46.1%. The fact that our obesity percentage dropped 13.9% from the previous period is an indicator why the overweight percentages above increased.

MENTAL HEALTH INDEX

The 2023 Mental Health Index, is a measure of socioeconomic and health factors correlated with self-reported poor mental health. The counties are ranked from 1 (low need) to 5 (high need) based on their index value relative to similar locations within the region. Barton County is ranked as a 4 at 48. The worst county is Sedgwick a 5 at 77.2. The best is Haskell a 1 at .7. 67 counties are better than Barton and 11 are worse.




HEALTH EQUITY INDEX




FOOD INSECURITY INDEX






Adults 65+ with Total Tooth Loss: Oral health has been shown to impact overall health and well-being.




