#### 1st Annual Bottoms Up Bike Ride

Clara Barton Hospital hosted the 1st annual Bottoms Up Bike Ride on Labor Day weekend. 30 cyclists joined to ride the 16, 23, and 27 mile routes.

#### Providers Guide It... Walkers Stride It

Clara Barton Hospital and Clinics launched the Providers Guide It... Walkers Stride It program that takes place the third Wednesday of each month. Clara Barton providers take turns leading a walk and talk around the Clara Barton Hospital walking path.





#### **Mastering Cerner**

All Clara Barton locations have continued to work toward mastering Cerner (electronic health records system) and have improved communication between facilities, patients & care givers.

#### Pathways Grant

Year two of the three year Pathways Grant has had a great impact on not only our hospital but our community as well. Clara Barton Hospital was able to lay sidewalk on the East and West sides of the hospital, creating a 1/2 mile walking path around the hospital perimeter. Benches and doggy waste stations were also installed around the path. USD 431 received \$20,000 to purchase water fill stations for each of the four schools as well as the activity center. They also used the funds to purchase a clear water bottle for each student. The Work-site Wellness pathway is also off to a great start with seven local businesses committed to making their work-site a healthier place. Clara Barton Providers started giving prescriptions for physical fitness, encouraging patients to be more active. Baileys Food Bin became eligible to receive \$6,000 in grant funds for the replacement of their current lighting to LED lighting saving approximately \$250/month in electric bills.





#### **CBH Nursing Staff Receives Recognition**

The Clara Barton Hospital Nursing Staff received recognition for being one of the top five hospitals in Kansas with the highest nurse-patient communication scores. Eighty-eight percent of patients at Clara Barton Hospital responded that during their stay the nurses continually displayed exceptional communication.
