

Genius Hologic 3D Mammography Exams

Clara Barton Hospital Imaging Services added 3D Mammography exams which provide hundreds of high quality images, allowing our radiologist to see each layer of tissue, slice by slice. 3D mammography detects up to 65% more invasive breast cancers than the average 2D mammogram. In addition to the new machine, we also invested in a comfort paddle that decreases patient discomfort by up to 90%.



Certified Patient-Centered Medical Home

All three Clara Barton Medical Clinic locations received certification as Patient-Centered Medical Homes by the National Committee for Quality Assurance (NCQA). This means they have adopted a patient-focused model of care which emphasizes the quality of care, enhancing patient experiences, building better relationships between patients and providers, and providing additional clinical services to better serve our patient's needs.



New PAs at Clara Barton Medical Clinics

Clara Barton Medial Clinics welcomed Jenna Snell, PA and Brandi Goetz, PA in 2019, shortly after they both graduated from Wichita State University. Jenna sees patients Monday through Wednesday in Hoisington and Thursdays and Fridays in Great Bend. Brandi sees patients in Hoisington Monday through Friday.



da Vinci Xi Surgical Robot

The da Vinci Xi surgical robot provides our specialists with a magnified, high-definition, 3D view of the body so they can perform complex procedures through just a few small incisions, resulting in less pain, less scarring and much faster recovery times. Additional benefits include: less re-infection, fewer complications, shorter hospital stays, less blood loss, and less need for narcotic pain medicine (opiod-free surgeries).






Diabetes Education and Nutrition & Weight Management



Thanks to the generous estate gift from Mrs. Ethel Glass, 2018/2019 membership, the 26th Annual Benefit Event proceeds (presented check for \$53,688), Class of '64 alumni donations, the JoAnn Bieberle memorial, FCCLA's pink-out donation proceeds, and a gift from the Ruth H. Nuss Trust, the Clara Barton Hospital Foundation raised a total of \$342,439 in support of 3D Mammography. 
Gifts from the Heart

The 2018-2019 Gifts from the Heart proceeds of \$10,625 funded a Transport Chair for the ER, a Sleeper Recliner Bed (for patient family members), and a Centrifuge for the laboratory. A centrifuge is a laboratory device that is used for the separation of fluids, gas or liquid, based on density. This equipment is not only crucial for day-to-day processing of lab results, but is paramount in processing the quarterly lab fairs where on average 250 vessels are separated in the device.



Surgery Robot Sterilization and Table

The funding of the robotics table and the sterilization system upgrade (totaling \$233,429), that assisted in bringing robotic surgery to Clara Barton Hospital, was made possible through Foundation reserves and the generous support of Jean Cavanaugh who made a contribution through her IRA. The robotic table pairs and links with the surgical robot, allowing the table to lean and tilt, as needed, without having to physically undock the robot and move it during the procedure.




