Building Better: New Great Bend Clinic Location

The new clinic location is at 906 McKinley Street in Great Bend, across from the big Dillons. This new 10,000 sq. ft. clinic is home to both primary care and surgical services and opened last spring. It has 18 exam rooms and 2 procedure rooms, which is a large enhancement from the old clinic location that only housed 5 patient rooms and 1 procedure room. The new lobby area provides a spacious and comfortable waiting area for both family practice and surgical clinic patients, enhancing patient comfort. Not only does the new location provide more space, but it is also situated in a prime location allowing easy access for patients.

Additions to the Clara Barton Medical Team in 2022

Additions to Clara Barton Therapy Services





Adopt A Room Donors Celebrate Clinic Completions with Private Donor Tours

In 2022, \$205,100 was raised and expended to the hospital to furnish and equip the lobbies and exam rooms of the new clinics in Hoisington and Great Bend. A total of 36 rooms were adopted and furnished by donors sponsoring a room. The new Great Bend family practice clinic consists of 18 exam rooms, 2 procedure rooms, and a spacious lobby. The Hoisington surgical clinic consists of 12 exam rooms, 2 procedure rooms, and a spacious lobby. Donors who sponsored a room received a sneak peek of "their" room and donor recognition plaque. The Great Bend Clinic was open for business on April 26th and the Hoisington Clinic started seeing patients September 6th.

In-house Pharmacy Renovations Complete Thanks to Philanthropic Support

Clara Barton Foundation provided funding for the construction costs of the pharmacy expansion. Pharmacy staff were able to move into the newly expanded and renovated space around the same time as National Pharmacy Week in October of 2022.

Foundation membership and event proceeds raised \$115,153 for this project. Contributions came from local businesses, community members, employees, family members, and friends of Clara Barton and the foundation. The new, expanded pharmacy tripled in size and features a separate clean room, centralized pharmaceutical storage, a designated workspace for staff, increased security and safety, and ample room for future growth. Thanks to Philanthropic support not only is the new space ensuring the safety of our patients and staff, but it will also enhance the care and treatment of all patients we serve for many more years.





Donors Fund 1,117 Square Feet of New Imaging Wing

We have come a long way since the last beam was put into place on the new imaging space in October 2021. \$279,250 has been committed/pledged to help fund the space to bring MRI in-house through an MRI Square Foot Campaign and proceeds from the 29th Annual Benefit (\$79,750). A donor recognition wall is currently under design and will be in place this coming spring recognizing those who donated \$500 or more (two sq. feet or more to the campaign).

Outpatient Services Transformed in 2022 through Sunderland Foundation Grant

\$132,000 was expended to assist with the expansion of outpatient services and the IV infusion area of the ER. Funding supported renovations to add 930 sq. ft allowing for a multi-function procedure room to be available for both IV Therapy and ER patient care, a large infusion treatment room with three IV treatment chairs, a private infusion treatment room, a nursing station, and a private restroom. Members who contribute to the 2022-2023 membership drive are helping to fund the La-Z-Boy treatment recliners for this expanded space as well as throughout other patient care areas.

Donors Celebrate the New Walking Trail on National Walk at Lunch Day

A 1,320-walking trail, outdoor classroom, and trail amenities were constructed around the new Great Bend Clinic location thanks to several generous donor and grants. Larry and Kathy Schugart (through their donor advised fund at Golden Belt Community Foundation) and the Schmidt Foundation were instrumental in kicking off the success of this project. In addition, many other grants and donation as well as support from other businesses and individuals transformed the property at 10th and McKinley with a walking loop, encouraging healthy life habits and strengthening the Great Bend community's health and wellness culture. \$132,896 was raised for this project in addition to discounted/donated services from Kelly's Garden Sense, Eldridge Fencing and B&B Metal Arts, totaling \$16,177 in in-kind contributions.







Transportation Program Gets Moving Thanks to Grant and Donor Support

Our organization discovered patient transportation to be one of the biggest barriers for patients to receive proper care. We partnered with the Sunflower Diversified Public Transportation, the Hoisington Trolley and Golden Belt Community Foundation (GBCF) to help provide better access and financial assistance for transportation to and from medical appointments and procedures. With a total of \$3,700 raised - \$3,500 in grants, 2 - \$100 donations from individuals - a pilot program was started, offering a scheduled pick-up from our facility and transportation cards for financial assistant. Moving forward, the transportation cards proved to be successful but the scheduled pick-up time was hardly utilized and has been discontinued.
